1. France's take on the Electricity Market Design (EMD) reform



The European reform of electricity market

> Protect consumer from the volatility of electricity markets while decarbonizing their electricity mix through the development of nuclear and renewable generation assets.

We welcome in particular:


- Action on competitiveness: reduce volatility / short-term markets, long-term price signals through PPA, CfD and the deepening of forward markets.
- Action on consumer protection: prudential regulation of suppliers.
- Action on capacity mechanisms: complementary cost coverage mechanism for security of supply.



Tools to protect consumers and investments in decarbonized electricity generations

➤ Enabling long-term price signals, reducing the gap between electricity bills and electricity production costs through:

- Longer maturities for long-term market products
- The development of Power Purchase Agreements (PPAs)
- The obligation to structure any direct public price support with Contract for Difference (CfD)

The European reform of electricity market

We also welcome:

- The new provisions for the development of flexibility
 - Removing market barriers
 - Defining flexibility support schemes with non-fossil fuel national targets including demand response and storage.
